Moments like these remind us how important friendship and companionship are in everyday life at Heathlands.

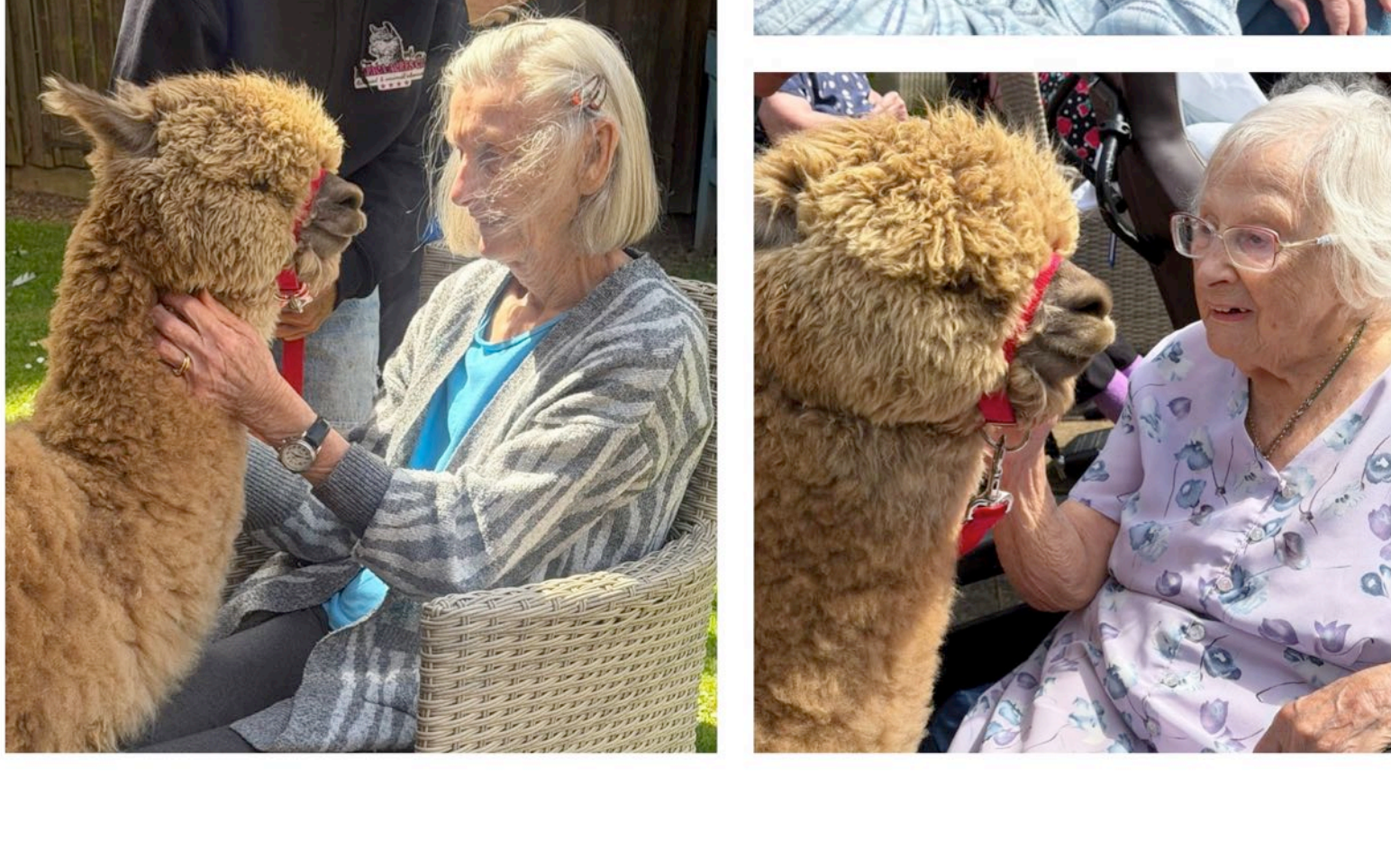


A Visit from Some Very Special Friends

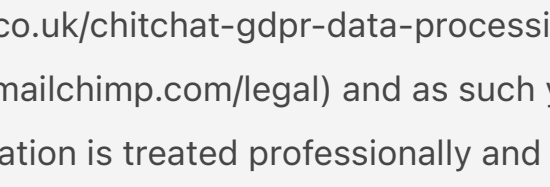

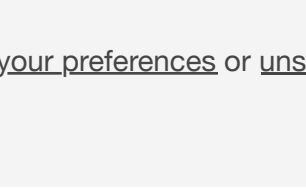
